Alfred's All-in-One Sacred Course was designed for the Christian student. The successful conceptual core and appealing music from Alfred's Basic Piano Library have been maintained. The lyrics and illustrations have been changed to reflect spiritual and inspirational themes that are important to daily Christian living. Most folk tunes have been retained. While learning basic musicianship skills, students will also be exposed to Christian values and principles as well as Biblical lessons.

The All-in-One Sacred Course includes LESSON, THEORY and SOLO material. This new course offers several advantages:

- 1. The student will need to perform from only one book. The need to carry multiple books to each lesson is eliminated.
- 2. Teacher assignments will be simplified, as the Lesson, Theory and Solo material are all combined in perfect sequence.
- 3. At the completion of Book 4 of the All-in-One Sacred Course, the student will have completed all of the fundamentals covered in Levels 1A through the first half of Level 2 and will be ready to continue into Book 5 of the All-in-One Sacred Course. At the completion of Book 5, the student will be able to continue into Level 3 of Alfred's Basic Piano Library.

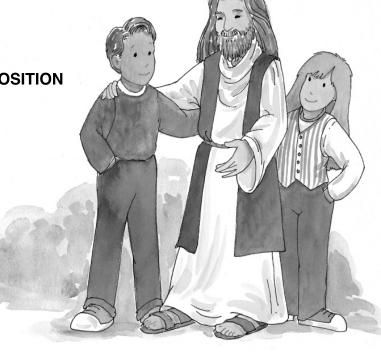

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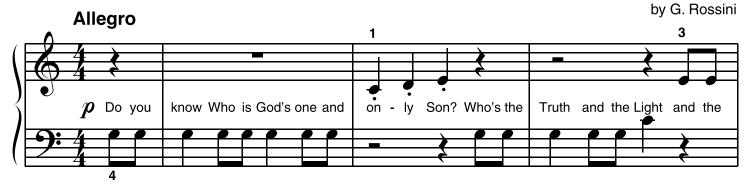


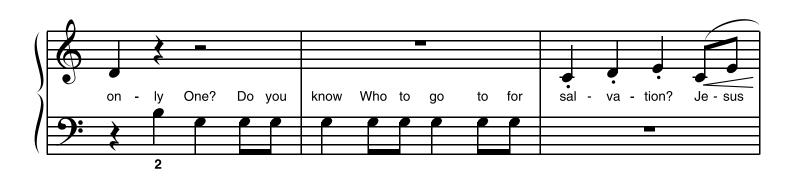
This piece uses both the **MIDDLE C POSITION** and the **MIDDLE D POSITION**.

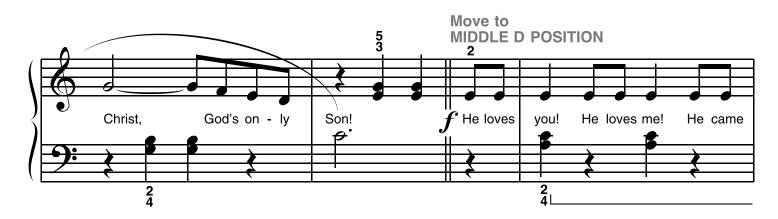


#### **MIDDLE C POSITION**

Adapted from themes from the Overture to "William Tell,"





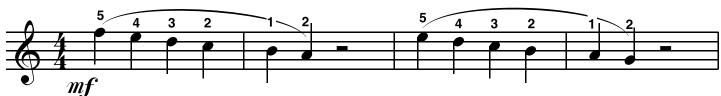


## Crossing RH 2 over 1

In this exercise, each phrase begins with a new hand position, one key LOWER than the one before.

Begin the first phrase with 5 on F, the second phrase with 5 on E, the third phrase with 5 on D, etc.











## Crossing LH 2 over 1

In this exercise, each phrase begins with a new hand position, one key HIGHER than the one before.

Begin the first phrase with 5 on G, the second phrase with 5 on A, the third phrase with 5 on B, etc.
