

Sputnik (spət' nik)

Your textbook talks about the Cold War and tells how the struggles between communist countries and the rest of the world seemed to ease. This is true. But it was only a short thaw in the Cold War.

About the time your textbook was written, the Soviet Union (Russia) invaded Afghanistan. This caused the United States and other countries to worry about communism in the Middle East.

Historians argue about when the Cold War ended. It ended gradually, like a melting ice cube.

Several things helped end the Cold War. In 1987 the Soviet Union and the United States signed a treaty. Each country agreed to get rid of some of their nuclear weapons. In 1988 and 1989 the Soviet Union withdrew from Afghanistan. Also in 1989, some countries in Eastern Europe overthrew Communist rule. In 1991 the Soviet Union dissolved into 14 separate countries. Russia was the biggest of these.

Most historians agree that the Cold War ended in 1992 when Russian President Boris Yeltsin and U.S. President George H. W. Bush agreed that Russia and the United States were no longer potential enemies but would work together as friends.


