Lesson 12

Materials:

- Alphabet flashcards
- Sight word flashcards: orange, blue, heart
- Color word flashcards
- Shape word flashcards
- Curious George Goes Camping, by Margret and H.A. Rey
- ♦ Worksheet 12

Skills:

- Review the previous consonant sounds.
 - → Using flashcards, review the previous consonant sounds.
 - Have the child list a word beginning with each letter.
- Review the short vowel sounds of Aa, Ee.
 - Using flashcards, review the short vowel sounds.
- Review the sight words, color words, and shape words.
 - Using flashcards, review the words.
- Recognize the sight words: orange, blue, heart.
 - Using flashcards, teach the sight words orange, blue, heart. Go back and forth between the flashcards, having the child recognize and say each word.
 - ♦ Have the child use each of the sight words in a sentence.
- Recite a poem.
 - Teach the poem, "Five Little Monkeys." Make hand motions as you recite the poem.

Five little monkeys, swinging in a tree,

(Hold up 5 fingers on one hand and swing them back and forth)

Teasing Mr. Alligator, "Can't catch me, no you can't catch me!"

(Shake one finger as if talking to the alligator)

Along came Mr. Alligator, quiet as can be,

(Slither hand along like a moving alligator)

And SNAPPED that monkey right out of the tree!

(Clap hands together loudly.)

- Discuss rhyming words.
- Develop listening comprehension and the ability to retell a story.
 - ★ Read Curious George Goes Camping. Then ask the following questions:
 - Where does the story take place? (It takes place at the campsite.)
 - What does curious mean? (eager to know about things)
 - How did George cause trouble when he wandered away from the man with the yellow hat? (He put
 out a campfire that campers were still using.)
 - How did he feel when he was lost and alone? (George felt tired and worried.)
 - George was curious and pulled an animal out from under a bush. What did he think the animal was?
 (He thought it was a kitty.) What was the animal? (It was a skunk.)
 - What did the skunk do to George? (It sprayed him with an awful smell.)

- How did George help? (He put out the forest fire.)
- How did George's friend help him get rid of the awful smell? (He gave George a bath in tomato juice.)
- How can your curiosity be good? (It gives you the desire to learn about new things.)
- How can your curiosity be bad? (It can cause you to get in trouble, to disobey, or to harm yourself and others.)
- Why should you be careful around fires? (Answers may vary, but they can burn you or can get out of control and cause damage.)
- Have the child retell the story in his own words.

Independent practice:

- Worksheet 12, part A: Read the short vowel words.
- Worksheet 12, part B: Read the sight words.
- Worksheet 12, part C: Draw a line from the shape word to the shape that matches.
- Worksheet 12, part D: Read the color word on each shape. Color the shapes.
- Have the child read the worksheet several times.
