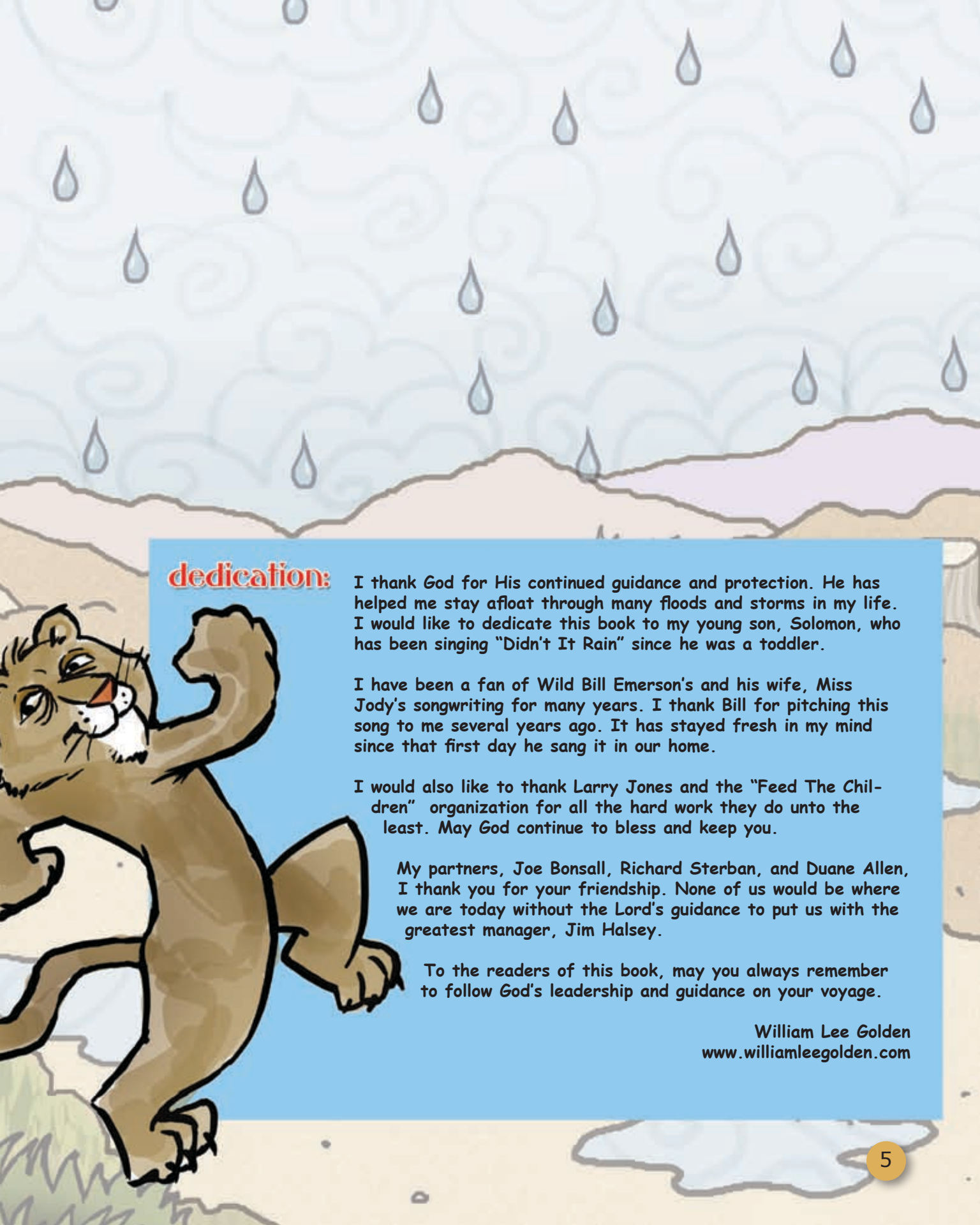

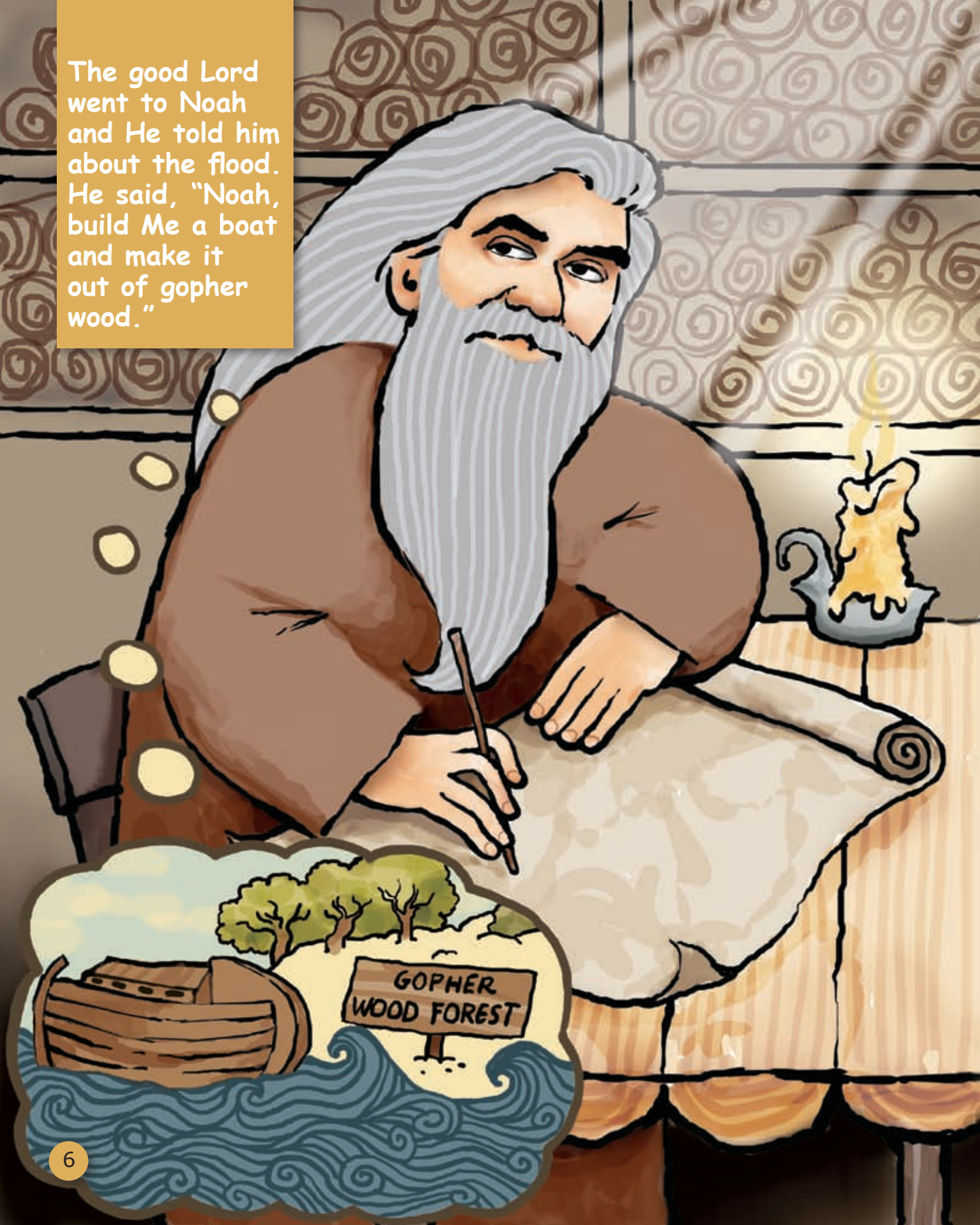
I would also like to thank Larry Jones and the "Feed The Children" organization for all the hard work they do unto the least. May God continue to bless and keep you.

The good Lord went to Noah and He told him about the flood. He said, "Noah, build Me a boat and make it out of gopher wood."

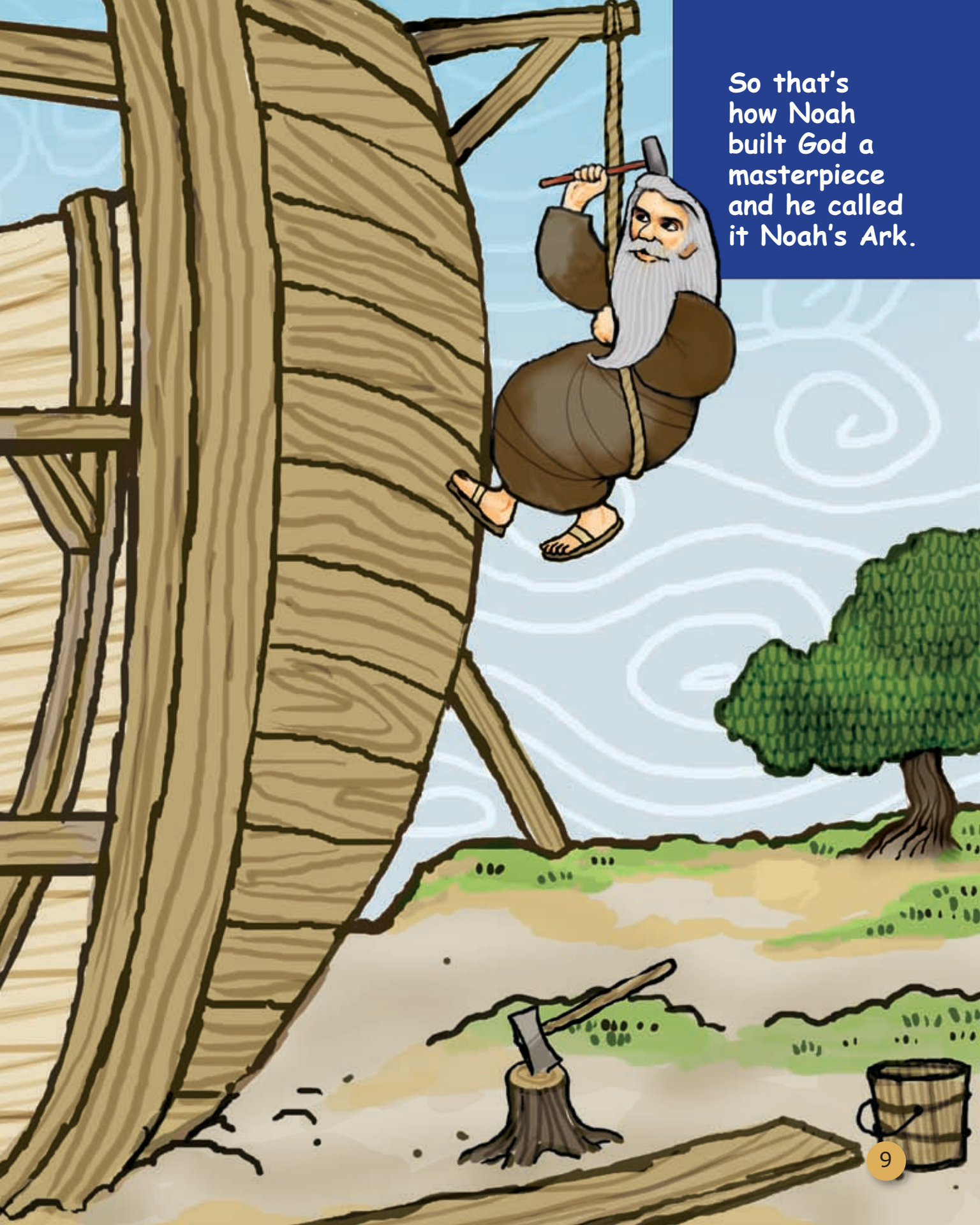



