- A closed syllable ends with a consonant, and the vowel is normally short. Ex: pen-cil, bun-ny, num-ber
- Words with closed syllables can be divided in one of the following ways:
  - » Between two consonants

Ex: bas-ket

» Between double consonants

Ex: hap-py

» After the first closed syllable

Ex: mel-on


