

Storybooks Set 4 - Fish Fun

Recommended for grades K-2

Primary Phonics Storybooks Set 4 is the fourth of five sets of phonetically controlled readers. Each set of ten storybooks corresponds to a *Primary Phonics* workbook in which students learn and practice the phonetic elements presented in the storybooks. Also available is a corresponding comprehension series, *Thinking about Mac and Tab*, which introduces beginning readers to early comprehension skills and asks both literal and inferential questions about each of the *Primary Phonics Storybooks*. The entire series can easily be incorporated into almost any reading curriculum.

Use this **sample storybook** *Fish Fun* from Set 4 with your students to introduce or reinforce the sounds of the **digraph sh**. Try this lesson today with an individual student, a small group, or the whole class.








Directions for Assembling Your Ready-To-Use Book

- 1. Cut the cover in half along the dotted line.
- 2. Fold each of the remaining book pages in half and stack them so that all the folded ends go together. You can use the page numbers as your guide.
- 3. Once all the pages are folded, place the front cover on the front and the back cover on the back.
- 4. Now you are ready to assemble your book. This can be done one of 3 ways:

Option A:


If you have access to a heavy-duty stapler, stapling the book along the binding edge will work best. However, there are too many pages to use a regular stapler. Once the pages are stapled with the heavy-duty staples, you may want to place masking tape along the binding to cover up the staples.

Option B:


If you do not have access to a heavy-duty stapler, you can assemble the book using string or twine. Using a 3-hole punch, punch holes along the binding making sure to line up all the pages so the holes match. Next, tie yarn or string through the holes to fasten the book. Be sure to make the knots loose enough to allow the pages to turn.

Option C:

3-Hole punch each of the pages and fasten the book using large brads or binder clips.


A sheep sat in the sunshine. "I am hot," said the sheep.




"It must be fun to be a fish," said the sheep.




"I shall jump in," said the sheep. "It will be fun to swim and splash."



A fish came up to the sheep. The sheep stuck his nose in.




"I see a rock," said the sheep. "That is not a rock," said the fish. "It is a clam in his shell."




"I see a cat," said the sheep. "She is not a cat,"

said the fish.


"She is a catfish."




"I see a bug," said the sheep. "That is not a bug," said the fish. "It is a shrimp."



"I see a big bug," said the sheep. "That is a crab," said the fish. "Look out!" 8




The sheep had to shake the crab. The crab let go of his nose.




"I see grass," said the sheep.

"That is not grass," said the fish.


"It is seaweed."

"I see a ship," said the sheep. "That is not a ship," said the fish. "It is a sailboat."




"I must rush back to shore," said the sheep. "It is deep here. These waves scare me."
