Intro to Parents & Teachers

This book is intended as a learning aid for students studying Latin with the *Latin for Children Primer B* textbook. It follows that textbook chapter for chapter. Thus, the vocabulary words learned in chapter 7 of the textbook correlate to those in chapter 7 of this activity book (but, as review, activities might also contain words and concepts learned from previous chapters).

Not all puzzles will appeal to all students. Feel free to have students do every puzzle, attempt a challenging puzzle only to return to it later, or, with your permission, skip some entirely. Our goal is not to stump students with impossible puzzles but rather, with a reasonable sense of challenge, have students continue practicing their Latin in a setting of fun, games, and playfulness.

HINT:

Unless otherwise specified, all nouns featured in the puzzles will be singular; students will typically be asked to supply both the nominative and genitive forms. Students will also usually need to supply all three nominative singular forms of adjectives (masculine, feminine, and neuter) and all four principal parts of verbs.

A Few Ideas . . .



- Have students use highlighters for the word search puzzles. This will help minimize the muddle of circles.
- Have students use colored pencils on the matching games to delineate one line from another.
- Encourage students to work together (when possible) on the more challenging puzzles.
- Have students create their own puzzles and games to share with others!

Note: For some words, we have listed multiple meanings that students will learn in *Latin for Children Primer B*. For other words, we have listed only the most common meaning. Students can check the “New Vocabulary by Alphabet” glossary (starting on page 199) if they find themselves stumped!
