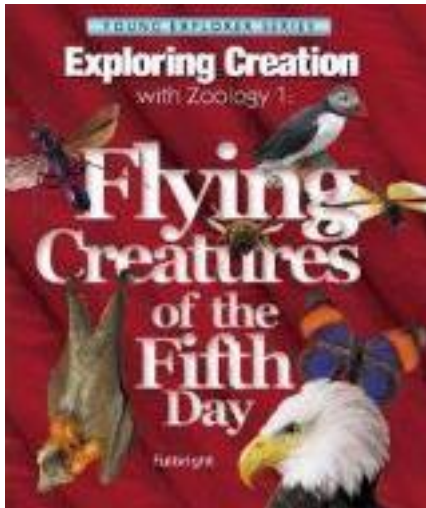

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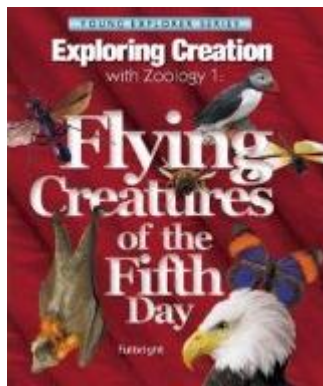

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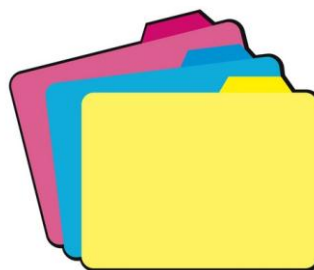
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How do I get started?

First, you will want to gather your supplies.

*** Assembly:



***Folders:** We use colored file folders, which can be found at Walmart, Sam's, Office Depot, Costco, etc. You will need between 1 and 4 file folders, depending on which product you have purchased. You may use manila folders if you prefer, but we have found that children respond better with the brightly colored folders. Don't worry about the tabs....they aren't important. Within this product, you will be given easy, step-by-step instructions for how to fold and assemble these folders. *If you prefer, you can purchase the assembled lapbook bases from our website.*

***Glue:** For the folder assembly, we use hot glue. For booklet assembly, we use glue sticks and sometimes hot glue, depending on the specific booklet. We have found that bottle glue stays wet for too long, so it's not a great choice for lapbooking. For gluing the folders together, we suggest using hot glue, but **ONLY** with adult supervision. These things get **SUPER** hot, and can cause **SEVERE** burns within seconds.



***Other Supplies:** Of course, you will need scissors. Many booklets require additional supplies. Some of these include metal brad fasteners, paper clips, ribbon, yarn, staples, hole puncher, etc.



You may want to add decorations of your own, including stickers, buttons, coloring pages, cut-out clipart, etc. Sometimes, we even use scrapbooking supplies. The most important thing is to use your imagination! Make it your own!!

Ok. I've gathered the supplies. Now how do I use this product?

Inside, you will find several sections. They are as follows:

- 1. Lapbook Assembly Guide:** This section gives instructions and diagrams which tell the student exactly how to assemble the lapbook base and where to glue each booklet into the base. Depending on the student's age, he or she may need assistance with this process, especially if you choose to allow the student to use hot glue.
- 2. Student Instruction Guide:** This section is written directly to the student, in language that he or she can understand. However, depending on the age of the child, there may be some parent/teacher assistance needed. This section will also tell the student exactly what should be written inside each booklet as he or she comes to it during the study, as well telling the student which folder each booklet will be glued into.
- 3. Lapbook Assembly Guide:** This section is written directly to the student also, in language that he or she can understand. However, as with the previous section, depending on the age of the child, there may be some parent/teacher assistance needed. This section will also tell the student how to cut, fold, and assemble each booklet.
- 4. Teacher's Guide:** This section is a great resource for the parent/teacher. In this section, you will find the page number where each answer may be found in the book. You will also find suggestions of extra activities that you may want to use with your student.
- 5. Booklet Templates:** This section includes ALL of the templates for the booklets. These have been printed on colors that will help to improve retention of the information presented, according to scientific research on color psychology.

Colors & Shapes – Why Do They Matter?

After MUCH research and studies, science has shown that colors and shapes have psychological values. These influence the emotions and memories of each one of us. In our products, we have used specific colors and shapes in ways that will improve information retention and allow for a much more mentally interactive time of study. Some pages may have a notation at the bottom, where a specific color is suggested for your printing paper. This color suggestion is designed to improve information retention. However, if you do not have that specific color of paper, just print on whatever color you have. For the most benefit, follow the color suggestions, and watch your child's memory and enthusiasm truly soar!

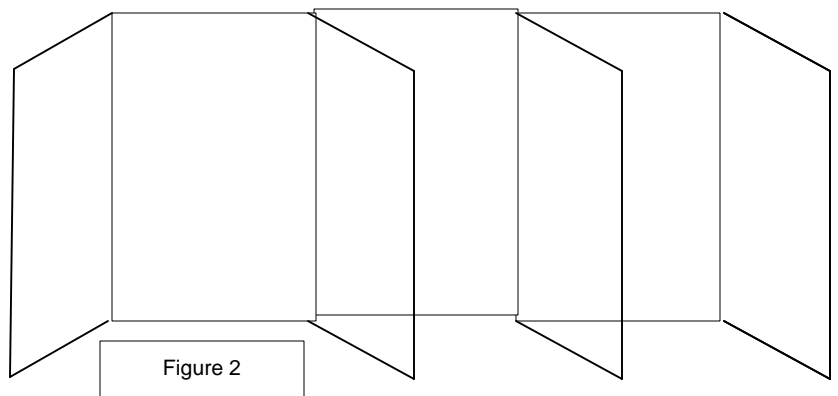
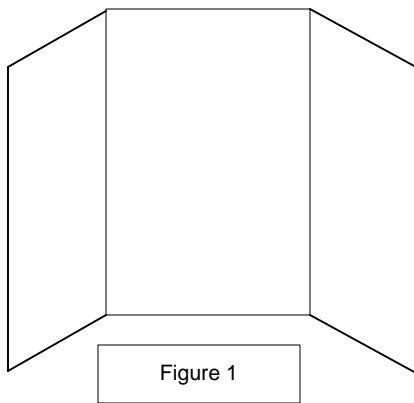

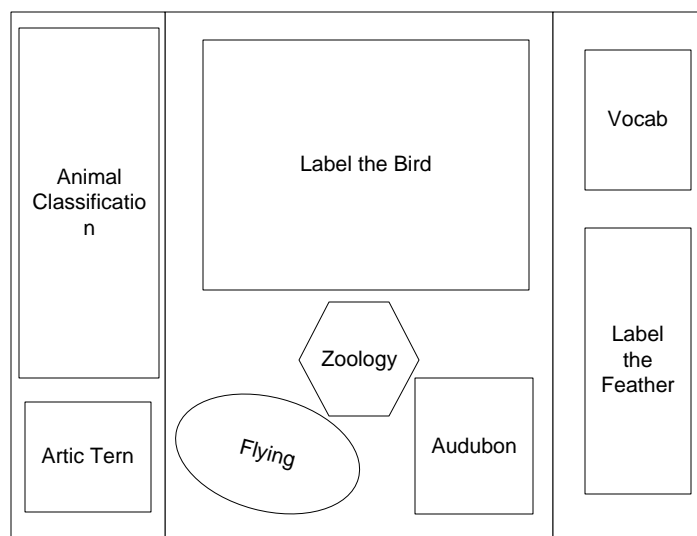
Exploring Creation With Zoology 1: *Flying Creatures of the Fifth Day Lessons 1 - 6* **Lapbook Assembly Guide**

You will need 3 folders of any color. Take each one and fold both sides toward the original middle fold and make firm creases on these folds (Figure 1). Then glue (and staple if needed) the backs of the small flaps together (Figure 2).



This is the “Layout” for your lapbook. The shapes are not exact on the layout, but you will get the idea of where each booklet should go inside your lapbook.

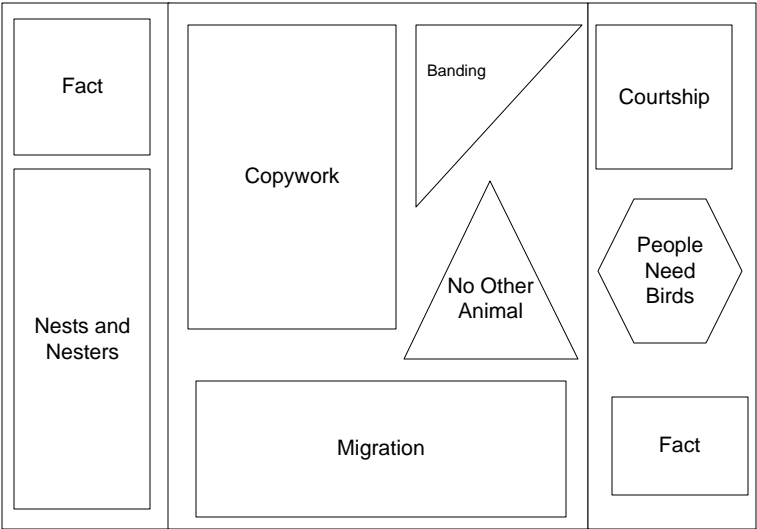

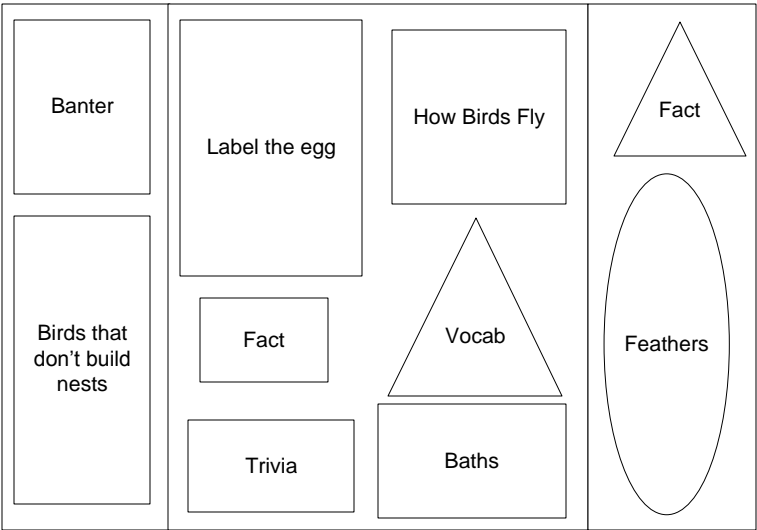

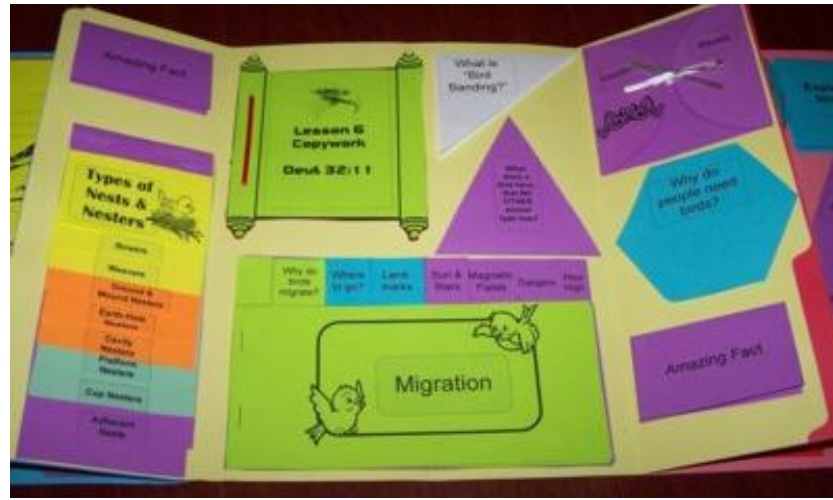

Lessons 1 - 6

Lapbook Student Instruction Guide

Decorate the outside / cover of your lapbook. The cover of your lapbook has purposely been left blank so that your child may decorate it in any style he or she chooses. Your child may draw, paint, glue pictures, etc. You may print coloring sheets and glue them to the front. The ideas for the front cover are endless. Choose a topic or art project from this unit and HAVE FUN making it your own personalized lapbook!

Lesson 1:

- What is Zoology? Booklet: Do you know the definition of Zoology? It's a big word! Write the definition here.
- Animal Classification Booklet: Did you know that every animal (even you) is specifically named, according to classification? These classification names are pretty odd-sounding. Can you write the names here? How about a fun word search to help you remember the names? Also, answer the questions regarding definitions.
- How Do Birds Fly Booklet: I can't fly...can you?? Explain God's incredible design for birds to fly.
- Lesson 1 Vocabulary Booklet: Try your hand at these new words. If you don't know what they mean, look back through your lesson.

Lesson 2:

- Why People Need Birds Booklet: Do you think we need birds? We sure do. Explain why here.
- Label the Bird" Booklet: Do you know all of the parts of a bird? They are different than our parts! Label the bird in the picture.
- What Do Birds Have... Booklet: Did you know that God made birds so special that they have something that NO other animal has??? What is it? Write it here.
- Bird Banter Booklet: Have you ever wondered how birds make such pretty songs? What is that sound that woodpeckers make? Here is the place to explore these sounds!
- Bird Banding Booklet: What is bird banding? Write about it here. You might want to draw a picture too.
- Audubon Booklet: Who was John James Audubon? Tell about him here.

Lesson 3:

- Types of Feathers Booklet: Did you know that there were many kinds of feathers? How many have you seen? Write about the different types here. You can also fan out this booklet to look like a "plume" of feathers!
- Lesson 3 Vocabulary Booklet: Have you learned these new words during your study? Define preening, molting, and anting.
- Label the Feather Booklet: What are the different parts of the feather called? Label this feather, and you may choose to color it also.
- Bird Baths Booklet: How do birds take a bath? Is it just like you? Explain the different ways here, and color the tub!

Lesson 4:

- Flying Booklet: Can you fly like a bird? How do birds glide, steer, and soar? Tell about this here.
- Migration Booklet: Do you know what it is to migrate? Why do birds migrate? Where do the birds go, and how do they know how to get there? Explain here.
- Arctic Tern Booklet: Have you ever seen a bird called an Arctic Tern? What is special about their migration?

Lesson 5:

- Types of Nests & Nesters Booklet: Have you ever seen a bird nest....up close? There are many different types. Tell about them here, and you may want to draw or glue pictures in also.
- Birds That Don't Build Nests Booklet: Did you know that there are birds who DON'T build nests? Write about these birds here.

Week 6:

- Copywork Booklet: Use your best penmanship to write this Old Testament verse. What do you think it means?
- Courtship Rituals Booklet: Each bird has its own way of "showing off" in order to have a mate. Can you name some of these ways?
- Label the Egg Booklet: Have you ever cracked open an egg and examined the parts? Try your hand at labeling this egg.
- Trivia Booklet: Now, see if you can answer these questions about interesting facts you have learned!

There are also 4 Amazing Facts Booklets. In these, you may write about anything you have learned. Are there some interesting facts you have learned? Take your pick, and write about them here. You may also want to draw or glue pictures inside these booklets.

Lessons 7 – 14 are covered in a separate lapbook.

Lapbook Assembly Guide

Inside of 1st Folder:

1. Animal Classification Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet and the text boxes (2nd page). Glue the text boxes on the back of the booklet, and then tri-fold the booklet, so that a blank is on the back, and the title is on the front. Template on pages 20-21.
2. Arctic Tern Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, accordion-fold the booklet, so that the title is on the front. Template on page 33.
3. Label the Bird Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, mount on a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color, creating a thin border around the edges. Template on page 26.
4. Zoology Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold along the center line so that the title is on the front. Template on page 22.
5. Flying Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of all 6 wings. Then, stack them together, with the title page on the top. Punch a small hole in the end of the “wing,” and be sure that it goes through the entire stack. Then secure together with a metal brad fastener. Templates on pages 39-41.
6. Audubon Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges, and then fold along the center line so that the title and graphic are on the front. Template on page 27.
7. Lesson 1 Vocabulary Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet. This will be in a “L” shape. Fold the portion that is on the right (bottom of the ‘L’) over on top of the section to its left. Now, you will have just a straight line in the shape of an “I.” Now, accordion-fold the booklet so that the title is on the front. Template on page 18.
8. Label the Feather Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, mount on a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color, creating a small border. Template on page 32.

Inside of 2nd Folder:

1. Amazing Fact Booklets (2): Cut out along the outer black line edges of each of the booklets, and then fold along the center line of each, so that the title is on the front. Templates on page 53.
2. Migration Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page. Note that you will have a larger “tab” at the top of each page. Stack them together, so that the title is on the front, and the “tabs” get progressively larger as you move toward the back of the booklet. You may secure along the left side of the booklet with staples, punched holes/ribbon, or punched holes/metal brad fasteners. Templates on pages 34-38. See pictures.
3. Types of Nests & Nesters Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page. Then, stack them together, with the title on top and with each page getting progressively longer and creating “tabs.” Staple twice at the top of the stack. Templates on pages 43-46.
4. What Does A Bird Have... Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold along the center line so that the title is on the front. Template on page 25.

5. Lesson 6 Copywork Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page. Stack together, with the title on top and the verse and blank pages following. Punch 2 holes along the left side, and secure with ribbon. Templates on pages 49-51.
6. Banding Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet, and fold along the center line so that the title is on the front. Template on page 25.
7. Courtship Rituals Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet. Fold along the vertical lines, so that the rounded edges almost meet, with the words on the outside. Punch a hole through each small circle, and tie a ribbon in a bow to secure the “flaps” together. Template on page 47.
8. People Need Birds Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges , and fold along the center line so that the title is on the front. Template on page 28.

Inside of 3rd Folder:

1. Bird Banter Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of all pages. Then, stack on top of each other, with the title on the top. Punch 2 holes along the left edge, and secure with a ribbon. Template on pages 23-24.
2. Birds that don’t build nests Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges , and then mount on a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color, so that you have a small border. Template on page 42.
3. Amazing Fact Booklets (2): Cut out along the outer black line edges of each of the booklets, and then fold along the center line of each, so that the title is on the front. Template on page 53.
4. Label the Egg Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges , and then mount on a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color, so that you have a small border. Template on page 52.
5. Lesson 6 Trivia Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet. Then, fold the bottom section over the next section. Then accordion-fold the rest of the booklet. Cut out the title box, and glue it on the section that ends up on top. Template on page 48.
6. How Birds Fly Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet (Be sure to include the wings in what you cut out). Fold so that the title is on the front. Crease along the edges of the cover, so that the wings appear to be “flying.” Template on page 19.
7. Preening, Molting, and Anting Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the circle. Note that there is a triangle in the middle, and it is a darker color than the rest of the booklet. Fold the “flaps” along the lines, so that the colored triangle is on the back, and the words are on the front. Tuck each flap under the one next to it. There is a diagram on the cut-out page. Template on page 29. Also, see the pictures.
8. Bird Bath Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the booklet, keeping the “tubs” connected. Fold in the center, so that the title is on the front. Template on page 32.
9. Types of Feathers Booklet: Cut out all of the pages of the booklet. Stack them together, with the title on the top. Then, punch a hole through all of the pages at the bottom of the ovals. Then, secure with a metal brad fastener. The pages will fan out like feathers, but keep them together for storing in the lapbook. Template on pages 30-31.
