

GENESIS

Key People:

1. The first human beings: Adam and Eve
2. The man whom God used to preserve mankind during the flood: Noah
3. The Patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob
4. The man whom God used to preserve Israel during the famine in Egypt: Joseph

Key Terms:

- creatio ex nihilo: creation out of nothing
- imago Dei: image of God
- patriarch: head of a tribe or family; founder of a group
- covenant: a binding treaty or agreement between two parties

Outline:

1. God created the world in 7 days. (Gen. 1:1-2:25)
2. Because man disobeyed God, sin entered the world. This event is called the Fall. (Gen.3)
3. Man became wicked and God punished the earth with a flood. (Gen. 6:5-8, 13-18; 8:20-22)
4. God confused the language of man at the Towel of Babel. (Gen. 11:1-9)
5. Abram is called and God makes a covenant with him to make him a great nation and bless all nations through him in 2000 B.C.. (Gen. 12:1-9)
6. God promised Abraham and his descendants the land of Canaan. (Gen. 12:1-9)
7. God destroys the two wicked cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. (Gen. 18:20-21; 19:23-29)
8. God asks Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac, but provides a ram for the sacrifice. (Gen. 22:9-14)
9. Jacob wrestles with God and is given the name Israel. (Gen. 32:24-31)
10. God uses Joseph to preserve the Israelites during famine, and Genesis ends with the Israelites in Egypt. (Gen. 50:15-26)

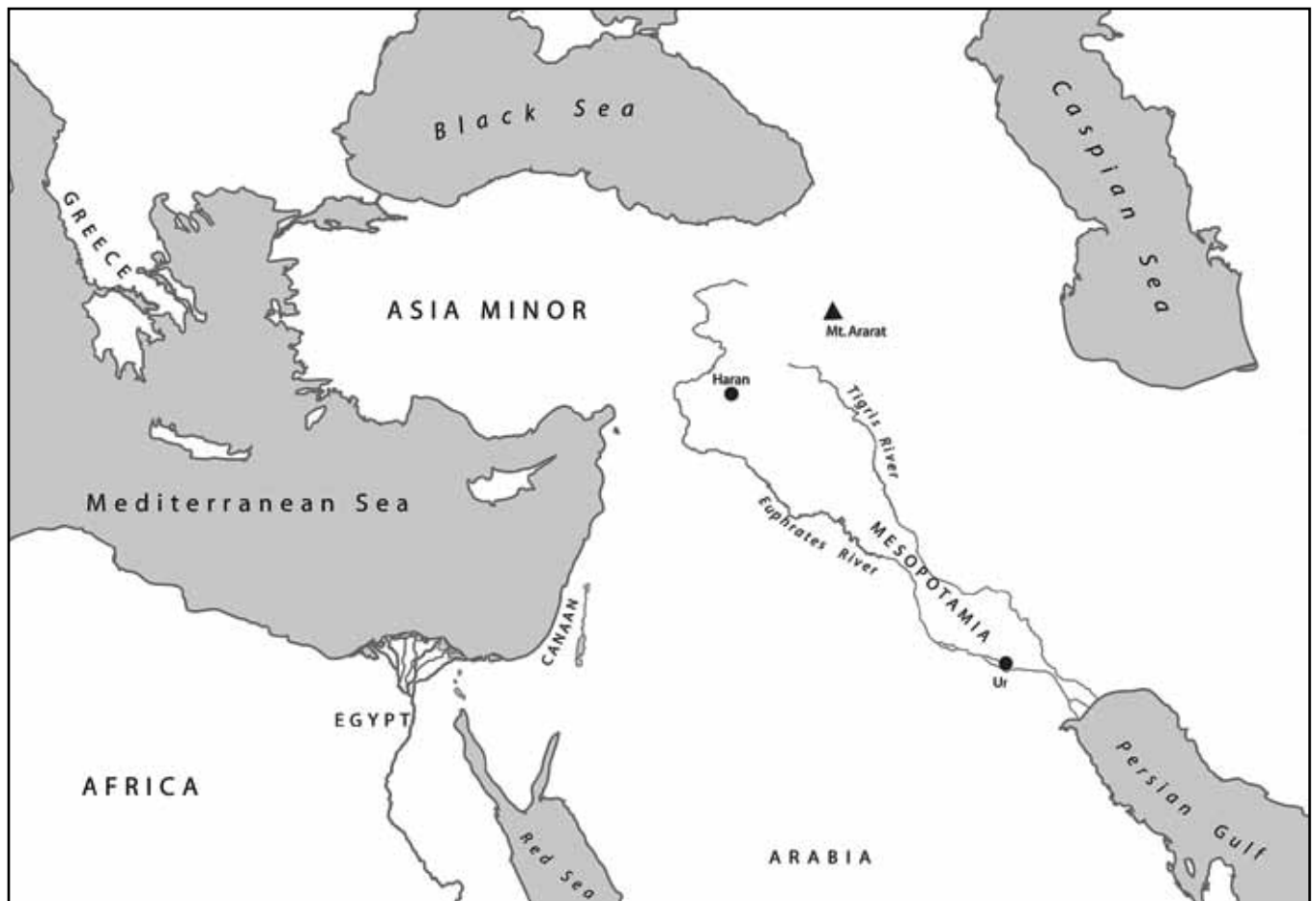
Genesis 1:26-28

EXODUS

Key People:

1. The man who led Israel out of bondage in Egypt: Moses
2. The man who spoke for Moses and was the first High Priest of Israel: Aaron
3. The man who defied God and refused to free the people of Israel: Pharaoh

Key Terms:

- redemption: rescue, deliverance
- passover: Jewish celebration of God's deliverance of Israel from bondage
- promised land: the land promised by God to the descendants of Abraham; Canaan
- tabernacle: tent, center of worship for the Hebrews

Outline:

1. The people of Israel are put in bondage and God calls Moses through a burning bush to deliver them. (Exodus 3:1-10)
2. Pharaoh refuses to free the Israelites and God sends 10 plagues to punish the Egyptians. (Exodus 7:1-5)

The Ten Plagues	
1. Water in Egypt turned to blood (7:20)	6. Boils (9:10)
2. Frogs (8:6)	7. Hail (9:23)
3. Gnats (8:17)	8. Locusts (10:13)
4. Flies (8:24)	9. Darkness (10:22)
5. Livestock died (9:6)	10. Death of firstborn (12:29)

3. Israelites observe the first Passover, during which God spared the firstborn sons of Israel. (Ex. 12:21-28, 43-49)
4. Israel escapes the army of Pharaoh because God parts the Red Sea in 1400 B.C.. (Ex. 14:21-25)
5. God gives Moses the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai. (Ex. 20:1-21)

6. The people are punished for idolatrous worship when they had Aaron make for them a golden calf. (Ex. 32:7-9)
7. According to God's command, the Israelites build the Tabernacle and the Ark of the Covenant. (Ex. 40:16-21)

Exodus 3:13-14

And Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them? And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.
