



### Chapter Four Advanced Map Work



**Hagia Sophia,** Constantinople's jewel! Find Constantinople on your map. Color Hagia Sophia and place it close to the capital city.



Ravenna is called the "capital of mosaics." Ravenna's Byzantine church is the **Basilica of San Vitale.** Can you find Ravenna on the map? A bishop of the Ostrogoths began to build the octagonal (eight-sided) church, but before it was finished, Justinian conquered the town and finished building the church. This church has a famous mosaic of Justinian and Theodora bringing gifts to the altar of the Lord. Ravenna became the home of Byzantine power in Italy.





**Saint Catherine Monastery,** tucked high in what is known as the mountain of Moses, is a fortress and shrine on the traditional site of the Burning Bush. On the wood roof of the entrance of the chapel, an inscription of honor says: "Our most pious Emperor (Justinian), and his late Empress" (Theodora). To find Mount Sinai, look for the Nile River down on the bottom of your map. Next to it you'll find the tips of the Red Sea. In between the two tips, down close to the water, is the location of Mount Sinai. Color this picture of Saint Catherine's and cut it out. Then paste it on the location of Mount Sinai.




**Ayioi Theodoroi** is located in Athens, Greece. Justinian did not build it; a Byzantine official named Nicolaos Kalomaos built it five centuries after Justinian. 



Tours was a very important place even before Charlemagne's reign. Charles the Hammer, or Charles Martel, began his defense against the invading Muslim armies in a field between Tours and Poitiers. Tours became an important place of learning and Charlemagne's greatest advisor, Alcuin of York, became the Abbot of Tours. Place the picture of Alcuin at Tours.


The hold the Frankish kings had over the wild Saxons was not always a strong one. Though Charlemagne was able to restore some sort of order in the area, he had one enemy he could not subdue for twelve long years. Witikind led the Saxon rebels, sneaking in to the French strongholds and killing the monks in small, unguarded places. This made Charlemagne so angry that he finally dealt with the rebels with uncharacteristic brutality. Finally, Witikind surrendered, accepting Charlemagne's generous terms. Place the pictures of Charlemagne and Witikind in France.

Charlemagne had three sons with his second wife, Hildegard. Ages four and three, Carloman and Louis were crowned kings by Pope Hadrian in Rome. His oldest son, Charles, would take over his empire. To Carloman, whose name was changed to Pepin, he gave the kingdom of Italy. To Louis, he gave the kingdom of Aquitaine. Place Louis's picture just below Tours. Place Pepin's picture in northern Italy, above Rome. Place Charles' picture in the center of the empire. For most of their lives, these young sons lived Charlemagne's plans. But when Charles and Pepin died in their early thirties, Louis became Charlemagne's heir. He was known as Louis the Pious.






