Activity 3: Game: Look for Gold Juego: Busca el Oro

(Hweh-goh: Boo-skah el Oh-doh)

Before teaching Activity 3, hide a bunch of "gold coins" throughout the room. Have your kids sit in a circle. Show them the picture on page 54 of the rainbow, the pot of gold and the leprechaun. Tell then they get to pretend to be leprechauns and go on a scavenger hunt for gold. They each get to wear a "duende" name tag from page 55 and other fun items. (See the box below.) If you have a large class let them play in shifts. If possible give them each a "small black pot" to put the coins in when they find them.

Once your little "duendes" or "leprechauns" find some coins, they should go to the circle and sit down. Place the large empty pot in the center of the circle. Have the children take turns counting the coins they find aloud in Spanish as they transfer them to the large black pot. At the end you will have a "pot of gold." Cheer everyone on for counting their coins in Spanish! Play Spanish in March CD Track 4. It teaches the vocabulary needed to carry out this activity in Spanish!

Fun Options!

At a dollar store I found gold coins, Leprechaun hats and headbands. For the pot of gold I found a large black plastic bowl and for small pots of gold I found packs of 12 black paper cups. See page 10 for more ideas.

Activity 4: A Rainbow (Un Arco Iris)

(Oon Ahr-koh Ee-dees)

My daughter has always been attracted to rainbows. I think a lot of kids are! The beautiful colors, the miracle of how they appear in the sky and the fact that children can bring a rainbow to life with a piece of paper and a box of crayons are all reasons why I believe kids love rainbows!

In this activity you will put a rainbow together! To begin, grab the children's attention by acting a bit sad as you pull out the rainbow pieces from page 56. The rainbow has fallen apart! Lay the colored rainbow pieces on the floor in random order. Tell the kids that you will need help to recall how to say the colors in Spanish.

Suddenly, a grand idea comes to you! You heard there is a Spanish-speaking leprechaun (duende) who lives at the end of the rainbow. If you call the leprechaun maybe he will help you learn the colors in Spanish so you can put the rainbow back together! Get the kids excited to call the leprechaun for help!

With the rainbow arches on the floor in disarray and your phone in hand, pretend to call the leprechaun who lives at the end of the rainbow. Play **Spanish in March CD Track 5**. The CD will place the phone call for you and walk you and your students through putting the rainbow together!



Activity 12:

Game: Pot of Gold Alphabet Juego: Alfabeto y La Olla de Oro

(Hweh-goh: All-fah-beh-toh ee Lah Oh-yah deh Oh-doh)

This game simulates the game BINGO. It's also a fun way to focus on mastering one color-coded section of the alphabet at a time. Tape individual letters from one section of the alphabet to mini "pots of gold" as in the picture below. For the pots of gold use black paper cups. Keep it simple and write the letters on post-it notes and stick them on the mini pots of gold.

You will play as a class using one set of pots of gold that all will share. Give the children fake gold coins. Call out a letter. The children must put one coin into the pot of gold with that letter. When all of the mini pots of gold have coins in them, name the letters again but this time let the kids take turns taking the coins out and putting them in the single large pot of gold.

Activity 14: The Alphabet Song La Canción del Alfabeto

(Lah Kahn-see-ohn del All-fah-beh-toh)

It's time to get up and boogie to "The Alphabet Song!" Before you play the song on **Spanish in March CD Track 12**, have your students stand and walk through how to act out the following letters as described in the table on the next page. For extra help be sure to watch **Spanish in March Training Video**, **Activity 14** (located next to the **Spanish in March Book and CD** at **www.oneilllanguage.com**)

After practicing the actions for the letters play the song on **Track 12**. "The Alphabet Song" repeats each verse twice. Kids really enjoy singing the alphabet and acting out the letters! Be prepared, this may become one of your kid's favorite Spanish songs!


