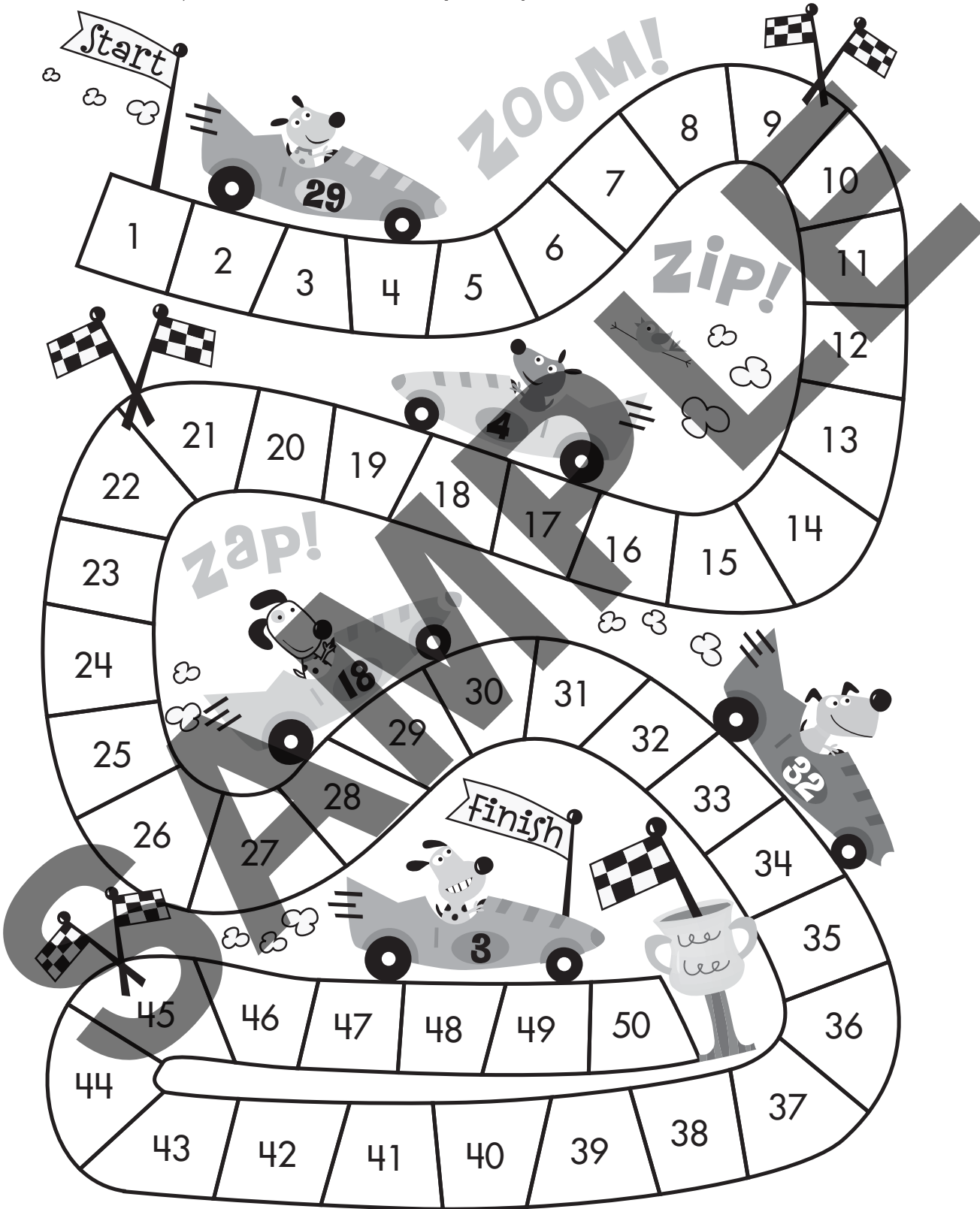


Color in a square for each activity completed.
