When completely dry, place the tracking stickers on the bottom of each rock. You and the finder can post pictures on our Facebook and Instagram sites with the #creativityforkids hashtag. That way you can share your creativity with rock painters and finders everywhere!

Remember, always seek adult permission and assistance before visiting any social media sites and when hiding your rocks.

HIDE YOUR ROCKS

Now place your rocks where people will find them. While you are out hiding rocks, make sure you keep your eyes open, as you may just find a few painted rocks of your own.

Although the paint included in your set is weather-resistant, natural weathering or fading of your painted rocks may happen over time. Save any leftover paint to paint new rocks.

#### **BEFORE YOU BEGIN**

Adult supervision is recommended! This kit uses acrylic paint which is permanent when dry. Wear old clothes and cover your work surface with the included table cover.

Be sure to use the gloves and crafting apron provided. Clean up any paint while it is still wet. We recommend working near a sink, with water and paper towels nearby.

#### **SET UP**

Items you need from home:

- paper towels
- water


Open the Paint pour box and place your supplies nearby. Quickly rinse and dry your rocks to remove any dust. Put on your apron, gloves and spread out the table cover.

### **PAINT POUR TIPS**

Before opening this paint, shake the bottles over a sink and away from your face. You can use the paint as-is or follow this mixing guide to create new colors. Use your cups for mixing.


Adding white to another color, lightens it, creating a tint

When painting your rocks, you will allow the excess paint to pour off. Place them on the table cover away from the edge.

To avoid wasting paint, keep your rocks grouped close together when pouring the paint.

For best results, place small amounts of several different paint colors inside your cup. This will create the most interesting patterns and colors. Using too much of one color may result in a solid color rock with little or no pattern. If you don't like how your rock turned out, try repainting it.

We suggest painting two or three rocks at a time, filling your cup ½ way.



- Place a small amount of each color into your cup.
   To achieve fun patterns, create many small layers of paint inside one cup. Once the paint is in the cup do not stir.
- Keeping the cup close to your rocks, slowly tilt and pour the paint over your rock(s), moving the cup as needed. Use more paint or your wooden stick to cover any unpainted areas.
- Continue until you have painted all 10 rocks.

When the top of the rocks have dried, remove them from the plastic; they may stick a little. Rub the bottom of your rocks across a paper towel to remove any wet paint. Allow them to continue drying on your paper towels.

#### **ADDING THE TRANSFERS**

if you would like to add a galaxy themed transfer to your rocks, match the image shape and size to the rock, then follow these steps:

- Cut out the transfer you want to use. For best results, trim the extra paper away.
- Peel off the clear film and place the sticky side against your rock.
- Wet the sponge and lightly press the back of the transfer against the rock.
   Peel up the corner to make sure it is adhered. If not, use a bit more water.
   Do not move the transfer until it is adhered.
