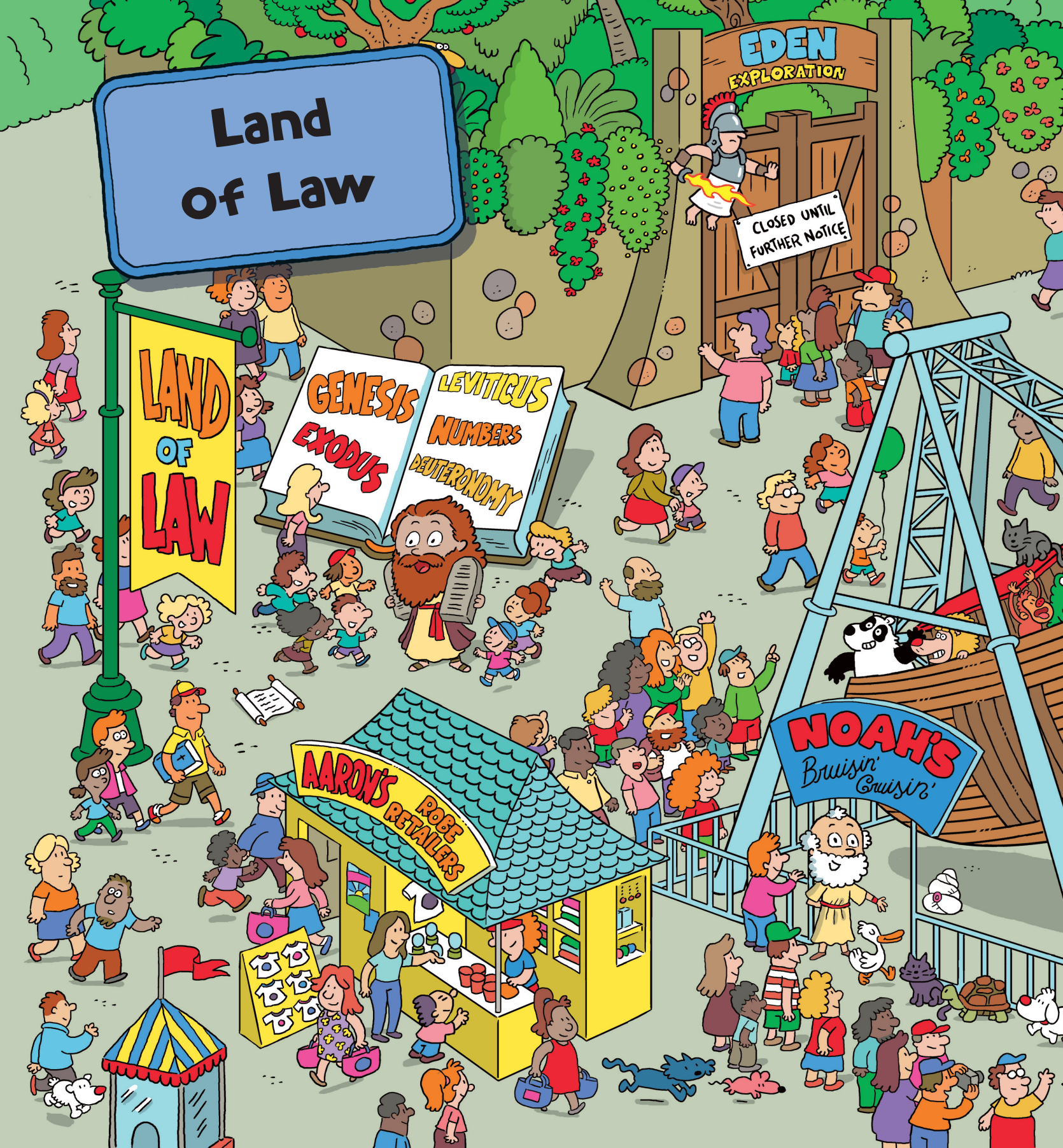
Let's go explore what's in the Bible!



Wow! There are nine ways to explore the Bible. Four entrances lead us into the Old Testament and five take us into the New Testament. I wonder where we should go first?



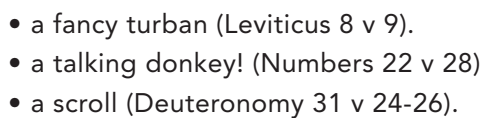
As you explore, try to spot how each ride matches a story from the Bible. Don't worry if you're not sure—you can find the answers at the back of the book—but have fun trying to guess before you peek!



The Land of Law it is! This is where the Bible begins, in the section called the Old Testament. Moses is really popular here. He wrote the first five books of the Bible, from Genesis to Deuteronomy. Together they're known as the Law, or the Torah. They include stories from earliest times, as well as God's guides for living.

The main message here is that God created us and loves us dearly—even when we fail. (And he made a plan to help us—even when we fail!)







This is the place of Kings and Heroes! In the Bible, these are the books from Joshua to Esther. Together, they're known as the books of History because they tell us about what happened in ancient times in the nation of Israel.

In this place we discover that God cares about how we live and what happens to us. We were

made to love and follow God by living under the rule of his chosen king.

We also get to meet King David here. That's important, because one day Jesus will be born as part of David's family.



Look around and see if you can find:

- seven trumpet players (Joshua 6 v 13) and a soggy sheepskin (Judges 6 v 36-38).
- a sandal, (Ruth 4 v 7-8), a slingshot (1 Samuel 17 v 40), and a crown (2 Samuel 5 v 3).
- a loaf of bread (1 Kings 17 v 2-6) and a fiery horse (2 Kings 2 v 11).
- a choir of singers (1 Chronicles 15 v 16), a bag of gold (2 Chronicles 1 v 12), and a royal decree (Ezra 1 v 1-4).
- a king's cup (Nehemiah 1 v 11) and a royal scepter (Esther 5 v 2).
