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
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# Using the **DIGITAL TUTOR**

You can scan the QR codes in this book for more practice with your spelling words. Here's what to do:

1. Use a mobile device to scan the QR code.
2. Choose your level—circle, diamond, or square.
3. Tap *play* to hear your spelling words read aloud and used in a sentence.
4. Practice spelling the words correctly on paper.
5. Tap *check* to see if you spelled each word right.



**WORD STUDY****Prefixes: un-, re-, dis-**

The prefixes **un-**, **re-**, and **dis-** can be added to the beginning of a base word to make a new word, as in **untie**, **reread**, and **dislike**.
