





Let them be for days and years. Let them give light upon the earth." And it was so.


God made the two great lights and the stars.

Genesis 2


God formed the man of dust from the ground. He breathed into him the breath of life. Man became a living being.


Now the feast drew near. It is called the Passover.

And the disciples began to question one another. They wondered which of them it could be.

will kiss is the man. Catch Him."




Now Jesus stood before the governor. The governor asked Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?"

Two criminals were led away to be put to death with Jesus. They came to the place that is called The Skull.


There they crucified Jesus and the criminals. One was on His right, and one was on His left.


