

THE VIKINGS IN THE NORTH ATLANTIC



This week's map has a bit of a different look. It is a "World in a Circle" map, rather than a flat projection map.

- Label the ATLANTIC OCEAN, ARCTIC OCEAN, GREENLAND SEA, BARENTS SEA, NORWEGIAN SEA, BALTIC SEA and NORTH SEA.
- Find the red dot between Norway and Sweden and label it SCANDINAVIA.
- Label GREENLAND, ICELAND and BRITAIN.
- Some of the Vikings moved from Scandinavia to the part of France that became known as Normandy. Draw a red path from Scandinavia to Normandy.
- Some of the Vikings sailed to Iceland. Draw a blue path from Scandinavia to Iceland.
- From Iceland, Eric the Red sailed on to Greenland. Draw a green path from Iceland to Greenland.
- Eric the Red's son, Leif Ericsson, sailed to from Greenland to Newfoundland (which he named Vineland). Draw a brown path from Greenland to Newfoundland.

CHALLENGE: Label the two continents shown on this map.
