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INTRODUCTION

Unifix® Reading: Early Phonics Activities is a starting point for small-group phonics study with **Unifix® Cubes.** The focus of these activities is the study of beginning and ending consonant sounds, vowels, and short-vowel word families.

Word Building For Success

Students benefit from hands-on practice manipulating letters to make words with recurring sound patterns. The activities in this book provide students with auditory, visual, and kinesthetic cues. Differentiate instruction by choosing activities that target individual students' needs so that all can participate. Monitor student progress and modify as needed. 
Unifix® Letter Cubes provide an engaging hands-on experience for students building words. The letter cubes are color coded red for vowels and blue for consonants, which helps students make a visual connection to the CV patterns. With **Unifix® Letter Cubes** students physically connect letters and begin to recognize chunks such as phonograms in word families.





The Activities

Word building introduces the letters with targeted practice for each sound or phonogram. Students build and write two words, then read the words and listen for the common sound(s).




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
Comparison activities reinforce the sounds introduced in the word building activities by looking at two different sounds at once. Students enjoy coloring in each picture as they identify and build each word.


Word ladders in each section target a certain sound position, except in Section 4: Review. In this section, students are challenged with changing letters in all three sound positions of CVC words.



The activities are designed assuming that each student group has a set of **Unifix® Letter Cubes.**






Warm-up Activities

Before having students do the activities, engage small groups in warm-ups:

- **Letter Formation** Copy the letter formation pages on viii and ix and have students practice writing uppercase and lowercase letters.
- **Letter ID** Write a letter on a dry-erase board and have students find that letter in a set of **Unifix® Cubes** and name the letter.
- Print Concepts Match uppercase to lowercase using Unifix® Cubes.
- **Rhyming** Say two rhyming words and have students name a third word that goes in the word family.
- **Letter-Sound Matching** Match beginning or ending sound items or pictures with their letters (alphabet books, chants, etc.).
- **Sound Segmenting and Blending** Say the sounds in CVC words and have students blend the sounds to say the complete word.
- CVC Word-Building Build one word at a time using the Unifix® Phonics Word-Building Cards.



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Beginning Sounds

In this section, beginning sounds are studied in three types of activities.

1 Introduce the Sounds

Beginning Sound Word Building provides targeted practice for each sound. When naming the pictures with the student(s), draw out the beginning sounds. Students build two words with the same beginning sound, then write the words and color the pictures. Model reading the words and listening for the shared beginning sound. As a final step, be sure to have students identify that letter in both words.

2 Reinforce the Sounds


Comparing Beginning Sounds is a fun, puzzle-like activity that helps students learn to isolate and pronounce the initial sound in CVC words with picture support. Building on their beginning sound practice from the targeted word building activity, they use picture clues to identify missing beginning sounds. They color in each picture after building that word.

3 Word Ladder Challenge

Beginning Sound Word Ladder draws on practice from the previous activities. Here students build a series of words with the same phonogram, changing beginning sounds to match the pictures and writing the words as they move down the ladder. Again, students color in the pictures.

Objectives

- Identify and use beginning sounds to make words.
- Substitute beginning sounds to build new words.






