# New England: Vermont




Write the word **quarry** on the blank. Trace over the faint lines and add your own details to illustrate a granite quarry in Vermont.


1. Look at Vermont's state flag, bird, tree, and flower pictured on this page.


# New England: Massachusetts





8. Color the Martha's Vineyard cottage with bright colors.







# South: Kentucky




Write the word **moonbow** on the blank.



# South: Tennessee




Write the words **underground lake** on the blank. Trace over the faint lines and add your own details to illustrate the Lost Sea in Tennessee.
