

The United States of America has symbols that remind us of important people and events. Some of these symbols are places we can visit.


Bald eagle






Our flag is a symbol of our country.

Each state has its own flag.










Fiction or **Nonfiction**

Stories can be made up or real. Made-up stories are fiction. Books of real information are nonfiction. Nonfiction books tell only facts. A fact is something that is true.




What You Need to Know
