## Lesson - The Alphabet

The building blocks of any language are the letters used to make words.

## The English Alphabet

There are 26 letters in the English alphabet.
The alphabet is made up of two types of letters:
vowels and
consonants.


## BCD FGH JKLMN PQRST VWXYZ

(all letters that are not vowels)

## The Latin Alphabet

The Latin alphabet looks like the English alphabet EXCEPT:
There are only 25 letters in the Latin alphabet.
The Latin alphabet has no W!

Latin has the same vowels as English, A,E,I,O,U, but they sound a little different. Here are the Latin Vowel sounds.

| Vowel | Latin Sound |
| :--- | :--- |
| A | ah, as in father |
| E | ay, as in way |
| I | ee, as in see |
| O | oh, as in no |
| U | oo, as in boo |

[^0]Latin E sounds like an English long A.
Latin I sounds like an English long E.
