Bible Story: A Wonderful Star

from Matthew 2



Key Points

- There were wise men at the time Jesus was born who studied the stars.
- They knew a king had been born when they saw a brilliant new star in the sky.
- The wise men wanted to find the new king and worship Him.
- They took special gifts to give to the new king.

In a country far away from Bethlehem where Jesus was born, some very wise men were **studying** the stars. One night they saw the most **brilliant** star they had ever seen. They knew it was special and that they had never seen it before.

The wise men who studied the stars had learned many things from books. They knew that the special new star meant that a king had been born.

They wanted to go and find the new king with the special star, so they could worship Him. They hurried and packed their bags. They could tell it would be a long trip and would take many months to get there. They thought the star would take them to the city of Jerusalem for the new king would certainly be born in a wonderful and beautiful **palace**! Surely, this new king who had His own star would be the ruler of the greatest nation in the world—and armies would obey his every command!

In their bags they took some very special gifts to give to the new king. "We must give him the very best gifts we have," thought the wise men, "for this king is sent from God." The wise men started on their long journey.

Bible Story: The Wise Men Bring Gifts to Jesus



Key Points

- The wise men went to the city of Jerusalem to find Jesus.
- The king in Jerusalem did not like the news that a new king was born.
- The star was in the sky over the town of Bethlehem. The wise men continued their journey.
- The wise men worshiped Jesus and gave Him their finest gifts.

The wise men followed the star and traveled for many months. When they arrived in Jerusalem, they asked where the new king was. When King Herod the king in Jerusalem heard about this, he was very upset. "A new king?" He did not want a new king to take his place! He thought he was the greatest king!

So King Herod pretended that he wanted to worship the new king too. He really wanted to find Him to keep Him from being the new king. He called men to the palace who studied the **Holy Scriptures** and asked them where the king, who was the **Christ**, would be born. They said in the city of Bethlehem.

The wise men continued their journey. They followed the star until they came to Bethlehem. When they came to the house where Jesus was, they were very tired, but they were too excited to think about that. They were going to see a very special king!

They went into the house, and they saw Mary and Joseph—and Jesus! The wise men said, "This is the King we have waited to see!" They fell down and worshiped Him. Then they opened their treasures and presented their finest gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

The gift they received was being able to see God's love come to earth. God gave the best He could give—His very own Son. They brought Him the very best gifts they had to give.

Bible Story: A Cruel King

from Matthew 2



Key Points

- The wise men had followed the star to the Savior that God sent.
- They remembered that Herod wanted them to tell him where Jesus was.
- Herod was planning to do something very wicked.
- God told the wise men to go back to their country a different way.

The wise men had found the king they were looking for! The many months of traveling over the desert following the star had been worth it. Nothing would ever be the same for them again. They had seen and worshiped the Savior that God sent to save the world from sin. They **rejoiced** with **exceedingly** great joy!

Then the wise men remembered their visit to King Herod in Jerusalem. They remembered the questions Herod asked them about the exact time they had seen the new star. They remembered that Herod sent them to Bethlehem saying, "Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found Him, bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also."

As they were thinking about going back to Jerusalem to report to the king, God told them in a dream that Herod was going to do evil. God told them not return to Herod but to go back to their country another way. They obeyed God.

When King Herod found out about the wise men returning home without telling him about Jesus, he was very **angry**! He ordered his soldiers to go to Bethlehem and kill all the little boys that were up to two years old. Herod thought that killing them would take care of his problem of a new king! But God was taking care of Jesus. He would not be hurt by the **cruel** king.

rejoiced: celebrated with great happiness

exceedingly: extraordinary; extremely

angry: very mad

cruel: wanting to cause others to suffer

Choices

King Herod was very angry. He didn't want someone to take his place as king. He had hate in his heart toward Jesus, and it caused him to sin and do terrible things to the baby boys in Bethlehem. When we have hate in our heart it always turns to sin too. Pretend you have two pieces of candy and your mom asks you to give one piece away. You have two choices: You can obey and have the joy of giving, or you can disobey and that is sin and always causes bad feelings in our hearts. Then those bad feelings can make you think bad things and sin more. We always have a choice whether we will sin or not. When we think we want to sin we can always call on Jesus to help us not to sin. King Herod could have had a very different life if he would have chosen to love Jesus.

Bible Story: Escape into Egypt

from Matthew 2



Key Points

- Mary and Joseph did not know that King Herod was looking for Jesus.
- The angel told Joseph in a dream to leave Bethlehem to keep Jesus safe.
- Joseph took care of Mary and Jesus. He took them to Egypt where the angel told them to go.
- The family stayed in Egypt until the mean King Herod died.

The wise men had worshiped Jesus and left to go to their own country. Mary and Joseph did not know that King Herod was planning to kill Jesus. But very soon they knew!

An angel of the Lord **appeared** to Joseph in a dream. The angel said, "Get up and take Jesus and Mary and **escape** to the country of Egypt. Stay there until I come to tell you that it will be safe to leave. Herod is coming to find Jesus and destroy Him."

Joseph didn't wait until morning to do what the angel said! He quickly got out of bed and woke up Mary. He told her they must hurry and leave Bethlehem. Gently, Mary held Jesus tightly in her arms. Nothing must happen to harm Jesus! Joseph prepared the donkey and quietly the family escaped in the night into Egypt. Joseph took good care of Jesus and Mary. He knew that God would help him protect God's precious and only Son.

The family stayed in Egypt until the wicked King Herod was dead. The prophet Hosea had written these words from God: "Out of Egypt I called My Son." This was written many years before Jesus had been taken to Egypt, and the words came true!

You will hear many stories about kings. There are good kings and bad kings. But there is only one perfect king. Jesus is the perfect One. He loves you and wants you to follow Him and live in His heavenly kingdom forever!

Bible Story: God's Plan Keeps Making from Matthew 2 History



Key Points

- King Herod and his kingdom on earth came to an end.
- Buildings can be strong but not strong enough to last forever.
- The most important thing to remember is that God cares about who we are inside that we love Him and let Him change our hearts to be good.
- You can be part of God's plan and live in His kingdom in heaven by believing in His Son Jesus.

King Herod did not live forever. He thought that he was the greatest king and wanted his **kingdom** to last forever. He built large palaces and had large armies to **defend** the **fortresses** and strong walls around his houses and beautiful gardens. But this king could not win against the plan of God. The walls of the wonderful palaces **crumbled**, and what was left was only part of a memory of his greatness.

People today **design** and build great buildings. They think that they are strong enough to last a very long time too—just like King Herod. But many things happen to change what people build. God helps people do pretty amazing things, but in the end it is not what we do but who we are inside that really matters. Nothing we can do or make will change God's love for us.

We are part of God's plan. Each person is more important to God than any building ever built on earth. But God looks at the inside of us and asks us to be made clean from sin. The only way we can be clean on the inside is to ask Jesus to forgive our sin and make Him our King. Then we can belong to God's kingdom.
