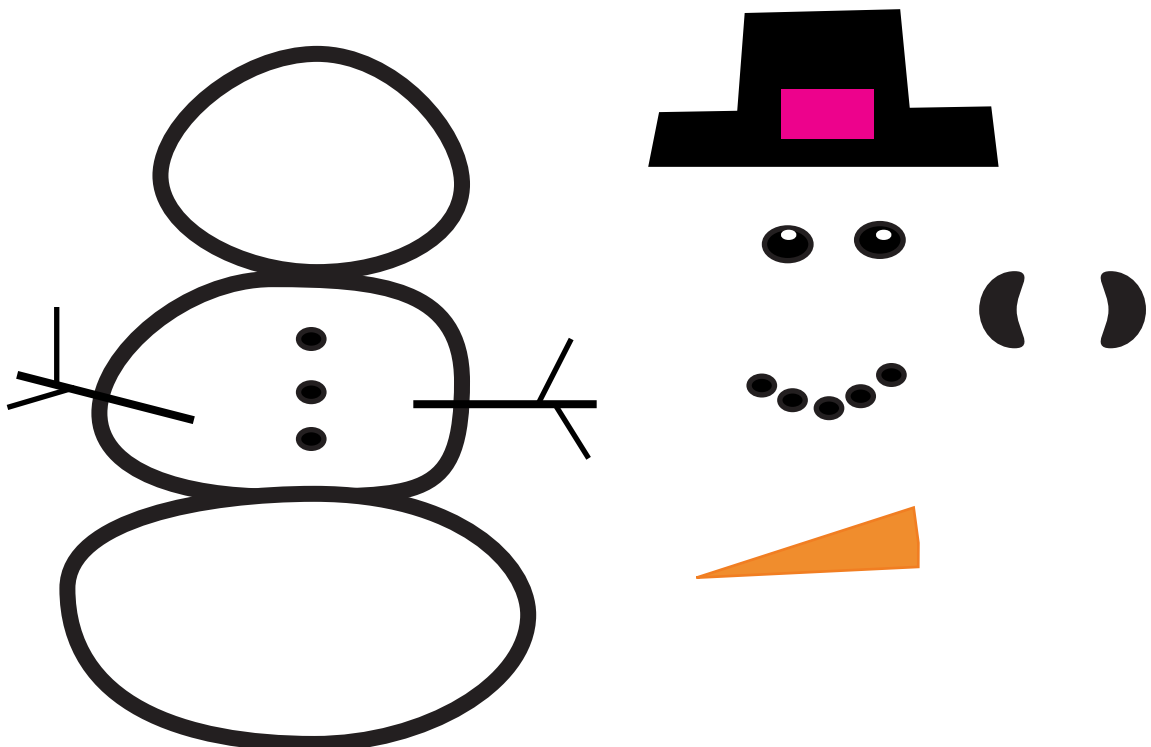

Activity 6: The Snowman El Hombre de Nieve

(El ohm-bdeh deh Nee-eh-beh)

Ask your students, "what we can make with snow?" Hopefully they'll respond, "a snowman!" Act sad as you show your students the picture of the three circles from pages 60-62 which make up the body of a snowman. Also act sad as you show them "la nieve" (the snow) in a bowl and the snowman's eyes, nose, mouth and hat cut out from pages 63-64. Tell them you're sad because the snowman has melted and is falling apart. Ask the students to raise their hands if they would like to help you put the snowman back together. Tell them that before you put the snowman back together, it's a good idea to learn how to say the parts of the snowman in Spanish.

Play **Spanish In January CD Track 7** which teaches how to say the parts of the snowman's head. Hold up each part of the snowman's head as it is named. You can also point to the parts of the head in the picture on page 59.

Activity 8:

Numbers 1-40

Los Números 1-40

(Lohs Noo-meh-dohs 1-40)

Kids enjoy counting in Spanish because it is a skill they usually learn early on in English. Counting comes easy for children in any language! Use **Spanish in January CD Track 10** to practice numbers 1-10, **Track 11** to practice numbers 11-20, **Track 12** to practice numbers 21-30 and **Track 13** to practice numbers 31-40. Decide which numbers to practice depending on the age of your students and how far they can count in English. Be sure to point to the numbers on the number cards on pages 65-68 as the class counts in Spanish. Giving your students a visual while learning to count is important. After repeating the numbers with the CD, play "The Ball Game" in Activity 9 to make number practice loads of FUN!

Activity 14:

What Is the Weather Like Today?

¿Qué Tiempo Hace Hoy?

(¿Keh Tee-em-poh Ah-seh Oy?)

Prior to teaching this activity, listen to and practice singing the song "Canción del Tiempo" by Doctor Jean. The lyrics are on pages 45 and 47. In this activity, you will chant the first part of each verse without the song CD.

In English, ask the kids what the weather is like today. After describing today's weather, hold up the picture of a **sunny** sky from page 75. Grab their attention by immediately singing and acting out the first part of the first verse of the song, "Canción del Tiempo." Stop singing just before you spell "soleado" (See song lyrics on pages 45 and 47.)

You will sing or chant:

Verse #1: Soleado, soleado, hoy está soleado.

While you are holding up the picture of the sun from page 75, ask them what they think "soleado" means. Hopefully they will guess "sunny." Next, encourage the kids to join you in acting out a sunny day by putting their arms over their heads in the shape of the sun. Have them join you in singing verse #1.





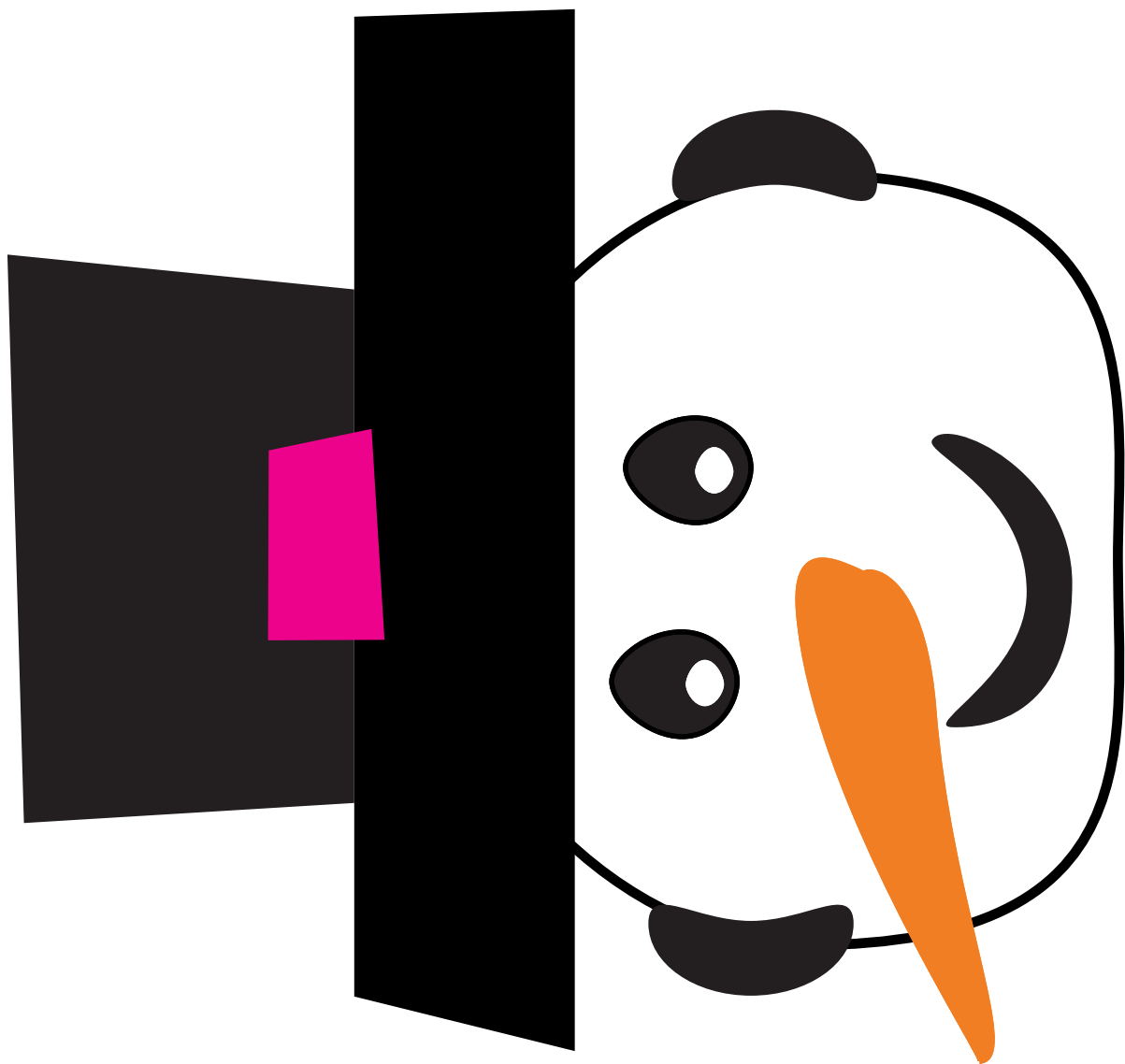
