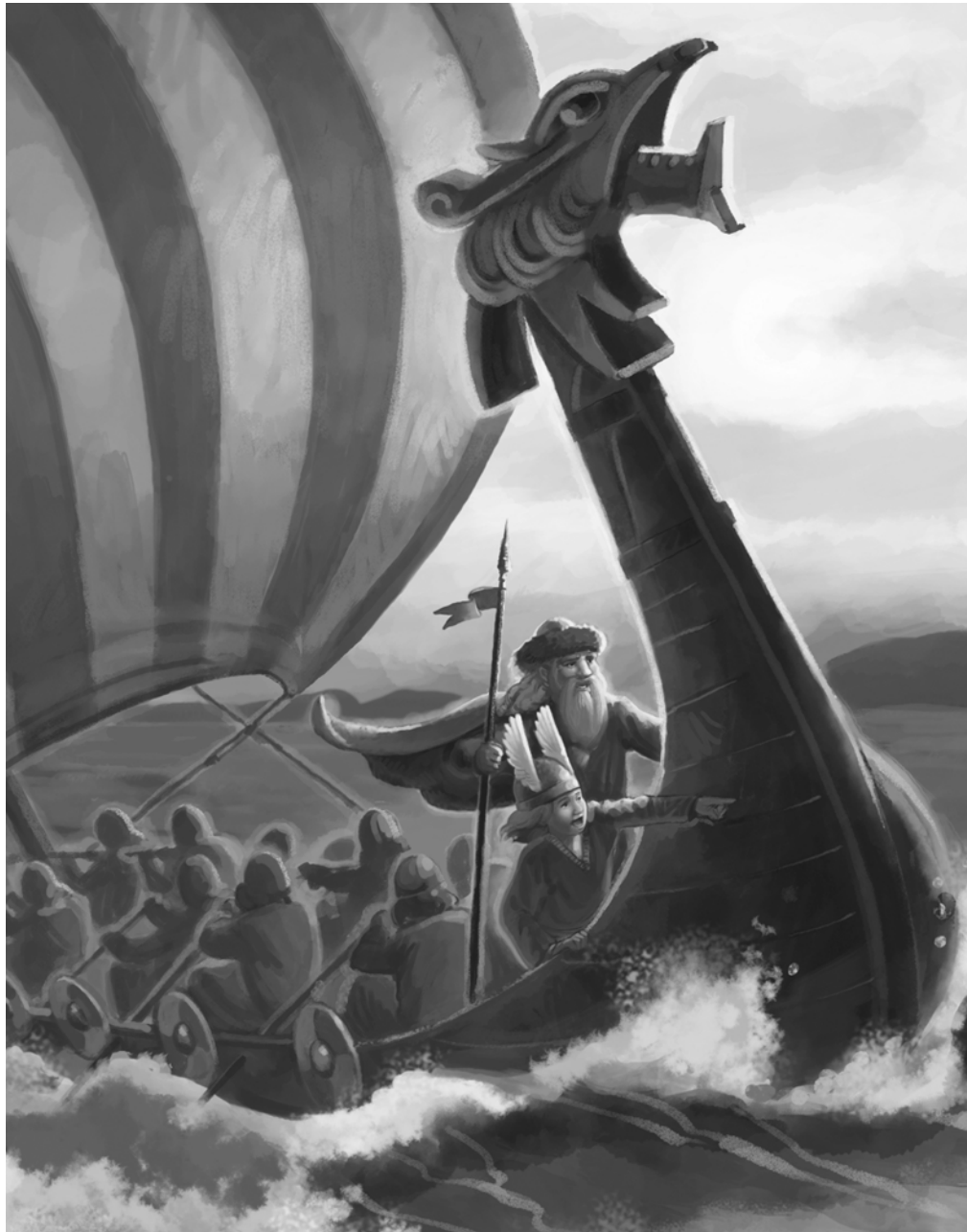

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Introduction

This test packet is provided by Christian Liberty Press to help instructors measure how well their students have understood the material in *Finding a New Land*. It includes eight tests and a test key. Each test covers one unit and consists of 13–15 questions per test. The tests use a mixture of true-false, multiple choice, and matching questions. Each test should be completed at the end of the respective unit being tested, following the test schedule found below.

The test answer key is separated from the tests by a divider. The test key is provided to help instructors to evaluate their students' performance. **Students must not have any direct or indirect access to the test key.** Any student access to the test key invalidates a given test or set of tests as a measure of student performance.

To assist instructors, we have also developed a separate daily work answer key to accompany *Finding a New Land*. This answer key provides daily work answers and occasional teaching notes.

Before You Begin

Start by removing the tests and test key from this test packet. Remove the staple and place the tests and test key in a safe location for future use. The test key has been three-hole punched for placement in a notebook for exclusive use by the instructor.

We also encourage you to summarize this introduction to your students before starting the course so that they will be adequately prepared for taking these tests.

Test Preparation

We strongly encourage students to be thorough in their study of the course material prior to taking a test, and to be diligent and thoughtful when taking the test itself. Students should carefully review the chapters covered on a test and study their answers to the comprehension questions prior to taking a test. Although questions on

the tests may not come directly from the written daily work exercises, the comprehension, concepts, and skills required in the daily work will be helpful when taking the tests.

Test Completion

When completing the tests, students may not have access to the textbook or to their completed written daily work. Also, they may not make use of the daily work answer key or the test key. All direct or indirect student access to the answer key or test key is a violation of accepted academic principles. Tests that reflect student access to the text or answer keys cannot be considered to be a true measure of student performance.
