What is an elective?

An elective is an academic course that is not in a required subject area. You can choose electives in your student's area of interest.

What elective requirements apply to you?

- ◆ Refer to HSLDA.org for current and accurate information concerning state-specific requirements.
- Some universities have elective requirements too. Do you know them?
- ♦ Planning on 1-3 electives per year is common.





Benefits of high school electives:

You get to choose electives to study.

Notes:

- Pave a way to a future career.
- Provide practical life skills.
- Rounds out student's education.

What qualifies as an elective?

- Ready-made curriculum (you purchase)
- D.I.Y. curriculum (you create)
- Components of an elective:
 - Learning
 - Doing
 - Showing

Options and flexibility:

- ♦ At home or in a group.
- Electives requiring specific equipment work well in groups.

Calculating a half or full credit:

- ♦ 60 hours = ½ credit
- ◆ 120 hours = full credit

Documenting your electives:

- ◆ Title & description of the course.
- List materials used.
- Names of mentors or educators involved.
- Dates and times spent on the course.



What is NOT an elective?

- Extra-curricular activities:
 - Are "outside of" the curriculum and are not considered academic.
 - Not listed on transcript and documented separately.
